North Northamptonshire Council Tree Planting Update:

- North Northamptonshire Council received funding for community tree planting events from the <u>UK Shared</u> <u>Prosperity Fund.</u> Thanks to this, community groups have planted 3728 trees this planting season.
- <u>21 new Community Orchards</u> with a total of 786 have been planted throughout North Northamptonshire, thanks to funding from the Coronation Living Heritage Fund.
- A new Micro Wood has been planted in Wellingborough following Miyawaki Methods and contains 760 trees.
- Other tree planting projects have been ongoing throughout our Country Parks and over 1000 standard trees have been planted thanks to the <u>Local Authorities Treescapes Fund</u>.
- Tree Wardens were given the opportunity to join us for some training courses within our Country Parks. Many of you joined us for the Basic Tree Survey and Inspection Courses and the Basic Tree ID Course.
 - We now have our own tree bank containing over 6000 trees to be used for future tree planting projects. There are also plans in place to set up our own Tree Nursery where local seeds will be collected and grown on.

Tree Warden Spotlight: Martin Toms, Kettering

Martin Toms, a Tree Warden for Kettering has given us an insight into some of the work he has been involved in over the last few years:

I have been involved with tree planting for about 15 years now and this was well before I became a tree warden. I run a local wildlife group called Natural-Ise and recently I have been involved in various tree planting and watering events, some with the group and some with schools etc.

In January 2024 we planted 110 trees that we bought from funding comprising a large variety of native trees on a field by the River Ise by Deeble Road. We have since watered these trees twice and all of these events generated a large number of volunteers. The trees are looking very healthy and so far we have lost less than 10% of them. Further trees have been added to an area right by these and they are looking healthy too. A local person grew on some oak trees from acorns and we added these in later with a group of children with behavioural problems. Around March 2024 I was privileged to help Hannah Dunstan of NNC with a tiny forest of 750 trees by the skate park on Ise Lodge as well as some trees near the river. This Tiny Forest is looking very healthy. Around the same time Natural-Ise planted a number of hazel trees in the Wicksteed arboretum as a hedge. In December 2024 I helped KSA school to plant a number of trees in their grounds, helping to organise the students. In December 2024 I was very happy to organise a tree planting with Hannah and a local resident who had been desperate for more trees in her area of Highfield Road Kettering. This comprised of around 150m of hedging and 50 stand alone trees. Unfortunately, the stand alone trees have been vandalised, but the hedge is still doing well. In February 2025, after months of raising funds and organising, I met up with staff, parents and pupils at Brambleside School, Kettering to plant a spikey perimeter hedge and about 50 stand alone trees in school grounds. A pupil had sadly died there and as he loved orange, I have been a part of an orange themed garden in his memory. In March this year I was told about some hornbeam trees that a lady had grown on and went over to little Harrowden and dug them up. Two of us then planted these in the field by Deeble Road, with the others. We have more ahead, with NNC planning 1,000 trees for 2026.
